Chris Spencer	<p>Naunton Park was one of fifteen projects GCC Education submitted for consideration under the DfE School Rebuilding Programme (SRP) in March this year. The school was visited by surveyors from the DfE in May to look at the building to complement the information we submitted together with their own survey information. As there was no guarantee GCC would be successful with our bid, we continued to progress the priority planned maintenance works. These works include roofing repairs, addressing damp issues, mechanical/electrical works and removal of the remaining asbestos, and are scheduled for completion in December 2022.</p> <p>Officers contacted the DfE again in October and in November to highlight the ongoing issues at the school. We have since been informed</p>

				<p>that the schemes they are prioritising under SRP have critical issues associated with the structure of the building and its infrastructure.</p> <p>Following their visit in May they considered that much of the external fabric condition had already been dealt with and that the additional works, which are on site, will address a number of other priority issues in the building. Consequently, they consider the school is not a priority when compared to other schools they are considering across the country.</p> <p>In terms of moving forward, we continue to develop a scheme of planned maintenance works for the school. These proposals will need to be considered against the other maintenance works which have been identified at other schools. They will be assessed on priority of need and successful schemes will be identified as part of a</p>
